

## POOL RULES YMCA OF GREATER DAYTON

## Your safety is our first priority!

- Parents or guardians are responsible for supervising their children. Lifeguards are on duty to enforce rules and to respond in case of an emergency.
- Swimmers under 16 will be required to complete a daily swim test prior to swimming in the deep area of the pool. Please review age requirements for additional details.
- **Age Requirements:** 
  - Children 6 & under must always be accompanied IN THE WATER within arm's reach of a parent/guardian regardless of swimmers ability.
  - Children 7-9 must be accompanied in the pool area by an adult. If they cannot pass the swim test, they must be accompanied IN THE WATER and must stay in the shallow end where water does not exceed chest height.
  - Children 10-15 must pass a swim test in order to enter the deep end. If they cannot pass the swim test, they must stay in the shallow end where water does not exceed chest height.
- Breath holding and prolonged submersion longer than 10 seconds is not permitted.
- Rough play, unsafe actions & improper behavior are not permitted.
  - NO running on the pool deck, dunking, pushing, playing on backs and shoulders, fighting, flips, throwing others into the pool, profanity, vulgar language, spitting or blowing nose in the water.
- Diving is not permitted in water less than 9 feet deep.
- Flotation devices must be US Coast Guard (USCG) approved devices, unless swimmer is with a Y instructor.
- Proper swim attire is required.
- Please shower before entering the pool.
- 10 Children not yet potty trained must wear tight fitting swim diapers in the pool and pool area.
- Glass Containers, Smoking, Vaping, Food, Beverages, and gum are prohibited in the pool area as required by the Ohio Revised Code.
- Safety depth marker rope is always to remain in the pool. Do not hang or swim over lane lines and safety lines.
- To ensure the safety of all, YMCA staff reserve the right to remove a patron from the pool if he or she is behaving in an unsafe or inappropriate manner.
- Lifeguard's decisions are final. Please respect their authority.
