If you have registered, thank you! It's time for another weekly suggestion. Our weekly suggestions are designed to keep participating organizations moving forward at a reasonable pace, so everything is ready when Advance-Giving and Giving Tuesday begin. These past few weeks, we have suggested that organizations set their goals, build profiles, and more. You can view previous weekly emails at [#IGC - Plan for Success Emails](#). This week, we suggest that you focus on **Peer-to-Peer Fundraising!**

Peer-to-Peer Fundraising is the #1 way to attract **NEW** donors to your organization! Think about **Peer-to-Peer Fundraising** as a social network way of raising money for your goal. Individuals associated with your organization (such as students, parishioners, board members, parents, etc.) have their own fundraising page on your giving day profile. They reach out to those that they know and invite them to give on their behalf. In Mightycause, you can set up P2P fundraisers in one of three ways:

- **Individual Page**- an individual such as a student, board member, or seminarian has their own fundraising page to raise funds on your behalf.
- **NEW IN THE MIGHTYCAUSE PLATFORM: Team Page** - great option for a group such as a board or class at a school!
- **NEW IN THE MIGHTYCAUSE PLATFORM: Event Page**- If you have an event associated with your giving day such as a gala or a dinner, you can integrate your page with Eventbrite.

Best Practices:

- In 2023, college students at **Saint Thomas More Catholic Newman Center and Parish** fundraised over \$55k for the Newman Center through P2P fundraising. The CCM offered a [range of prizes](#) to the students to gamify their efforts!
- **The Diocese of Lafayette Office of Vocations** had the seminarians fundraise to raise funds for their education. Three teams were created based on where the seminarians are in their formation. The team who raised the most funds won a trip to Top Golf and the team with the most donors won a gift card.
- While Peer to Peer is a great way to reach new and younger donors, older communities can benefit from this tool as well! Three volunteers from **St. Peter’s Catholic Church in Olton, Texas** each called parishioners, as well as everyone they knew in the wider Olton community and asked them to support their giving day!

Use the tools that work best for your community and what you are raising funds for!
