RECA Program Application Documentation

Catholic parishes and schools in North County and St. Charles County have been receiving increased requests for documentation for the RECA Program application.

The Archdiocese of St. Louis Archives created a webpage https://www.archstl.org/reca/ where you can learn what records are available to people, what information they contain, who has access, and how people can request records. Please feel free to refer people to this website for general RECA-related information, especially if they are requesting records from closed schools or parishes.

Attached are guidelines for parishes and schools processing transcripts, sacramental certificates, and other parish or school records. We encourage parishes and schools to follow the access requirements at https://www.archstl.org/reca/, particularly when the requestor is asking for other people's records, whether living or deceased. <u>Click here</u> for guidelines.

2025-2026 EPV Grant Process

Ensuring Parish Viability grants, awarded on an annual basis, are grants from the Archdiocese of St. Louis to parishes that have experienced demographic change to assist with capital project, debt, or evangelization efforts.

The process for Ensuring Parish Viability grants launched in August with a communication from Archbishop Rozanski to pastors inviting those eligible to consider applying for a grant. The timeline is below.

Ensuring Parish Viability (EPV) Grants Timeline

- August 11 EPV process begins with email from Archbishop Rozanski to Pastors. EPV grant applications become available.
- September 5 Parishes should request applications by this date to allow time to complete the application.
- October 10 Deadline for application submission.

Helpful tip: Submit your applications early if you can. Any application received after October 10 will be denied or possibly considered as a lower priority.

To give your parish the best chance of success, and to avoid having your application returned for correction, please be sure to use the helpful checklists provided with the application. Incomplete or incorrectly formatted applications cannot be accepted. Status Animarum Update

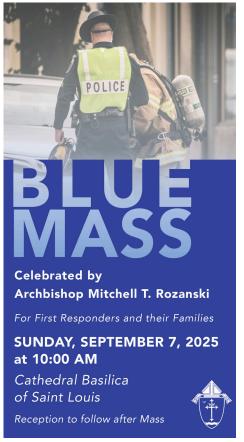

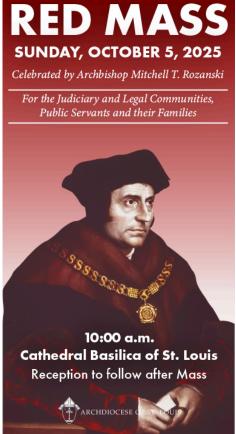

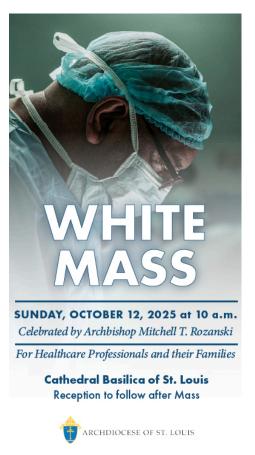

Importing Electronic Giving into Servant Keeper

If you are manually entering your parishes online giving contributions into Servant Keeper, we encourage you to consider saving your office staff time and increasing accuracy by importing parish online giving contributions into Servant Keeper. Exporting contributions from your online giving provider and importing them into Servant Keeper Contribution Manager can be done in just a few minutes. The same contribution reports can be generated and batches are posted the same way as manually entered batches. To keep contributions current we recommend parishes import their online contributions once a week.

PCI can Splashtop into your computer and walk you through the step-by-step process.

Setting Up Servant Keeper Online Office

The Online Office is the Web based version of Servant Keeper. It is a free tool available to all parishes. Now is the time to consider setting up the Servant Keeper Online Office for your parish. Below we have listed some benefits of using Servant Keeper Online office at your parish.

Online Office for Parish Staff

The Online Office Mobile App allows pastors and parish staff access to information and the ability to communicate on the go, keeping everyone connected and informed. Member data is always at your fingertips anywhere you have an internet connection. Parish staff can use Online Office to view your organization's directory, update member information, access downloads, and view the parish dashboard.

Online Office for Members (Parishioners)

- Parishioners can view their contribution history when they log in to their Member Portal and can print their own contribution statement from the Online Office Member Portal.
- Parishioners can view their pledge summary if you are tracking pledging in Servant Keeper.
- Allows Parishioners to enter the online giving link from your website, so members can click on the [Give Now] button in their Member Portal, it will take them directly to the Online giving page on your church's website.
- Custom links can be added for event registration and volunteering.

Ask parishioners to verify or share their email address with the parish office. Parishes can use the Online Office application to send email invites to Parishioners asking them to create an account. Parishes may also share the link to their Online Office in the parish bulletin. Once Parishioners have created an account in Online Office, they may update their information, view contributions and pledges, and print their annual contribution report.
