

Reaching Out to Those in Need

"It drags you down, being in this situation, so surrounding yourself with positive people really helps. And people here (at Bridge of Hope), you can tell they genuinely care for you. When I got here, I felt safe. I wasn't scared anymore." – Sara

Bridge of Hope is a new emergency shelter and crisis stabilization center near Troy, the county seat of mostly rural Lincoln County. In partnership with different faith and civic organizations, including Catholic Charities, it provides short-term housing for men, women and families in need. It also connects them with ongoing support and critical resources such as health care and access to mental health services.

Your sacrificial giving to the *Annual Catholic Appeal* serves the most vulnerable in our communities with dignity and compassion, providing hope through affordable housing and emergency shelter services combined with comprehensive case management, to help them regain self-sufficiency.

Leading Our Youth to Christ

"Unexpectedly, they (the campus ministers) became a source of healing. Some simply gave a space for me to share hurts and experiences that I did not know needed to be voiced. Others lovingly encouraged me to lean into all that I am and see my true identity as a daughter of God. Newman Centers provide students at five local college and university campuses with a "home away from home" where they can support each other in living and growing their Catholic faith. Through opportunities to gather, study, serve, and pray together, they share the hope of Christ with other students on their campuses.

Strengthened by the sacramental grace of Holy Orders, deacons serve in parishes, hospitals, archdiocesan agencies, and other organizations. They offer their time, talent, and energy to strengthen our Church in the Archdiocese of St. Louis. Their loving service extends into many areas of parish life, including the proclamation of the Gospel, liturgical functions, administration, and charitable works. The *Permanent Diaconate Program* includes at least ten years of intensive formation both leading up to and following ordination.
